\$10,000 REWARD

FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE EXONERATION OF ATF **SPECIAL AGENT WILL CLARK**

MORGANVILLE, NJ, FEBRUARY 16,2010: The National Police Defense Foundation is offering a **\$10,000** reward to any person or persons for relevant credible and significant information leading to the exoneration of ATF Special Agent Will Clark.

The “Safe Cop Program”, a congressionally recognized Law Enforcement safety initiative of the National Police Defense Foundation, is seeking information regarding the self-defense shooting, by Agent Clark.

Based on the evidence the NPDF has extensively reviewed, the following is the sequence of events on the day in question. On September 7, 2008, in St Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands, Will intervened in a violent domestic dispute to protect a woman who was being publicly threatened and assaulted by her intoxicated male partner. The incident took place at 57 Mahogany Run.

Will was convinced that the female assault victim was in grave danger and that he had an obligation, as a Federal Law Enforcement Officer to protect her. As the assault escalated, Will, himself, was placed in grave danger by the assailant, who was armed with a deadly weapon. Will fatally shot the assailant to end the assault and save his and the females life.

As a result, of his brave, selfless actions, Will was charged with "Murder 2nd Degree", "Voluntary Manslaughter" and two counts of "Using a Dangerous Weapon During The Commission Of A Crime Of Violence"

On December 18, 2008, the ATF Shooting Incident Review Board concluded that the shooting was justified and that Will "was acting within the scope of his employment and authority" and that "there was no evidence of misconduct or malfeasance on Will's part.

The NPDF supports Will in his quest for justice and exoneration.
